CAPITOL OFFENSES:

A REVIEW OF THE CRIMINAL CONDUCT, SELF-DEALING AND ETHICAL LAPSES OF NEW YORK'S PUBLIC OFFICIALS

The conviction of former Senate Majority Leader Skelos adds to the Albany's already swollen "Rogues Gallery" of corrupt and unethical elected officials. New Yorkers want action, not finger pointing exercises designed to wait out public anger. The state Capitol cannot be a political high-crime area and maintain public trust.

Inaction speaks louder than words. Failure by Governor Cuomo to convene a special session on ethics and inaction by the legislature can only be understood as a defense of Albany's status quo. The key measures for consideration must include: (1) a Congressional-style cap on outside income; (2) overhaul of the state's ethics watchdogs to ensure independence; (3) closure of the LLC loophole; and (4) transparent checks and balances on public spending. NYPIRG has categorized over a decade's worth of Capitol Offenses by state public officials into four categories to help New Yorkers understand the breadth and depth of misconduct on the Hudson in the 21st Century.
